




Student Satisfactory Survey (SSS) 2021-22




At the end of the Academic session an online Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted in the institution. 670 responses of the enrolled students were registered online. The institution has UG & PG Arts, Commerce & Science disciplines. Among the students the responses for B.A. were 233 students (34.78 %), for B. Com 138 students (20.60 %), for B.Sc. 167 students (24.96%), for M.Com.17 students (2.51%) for M.Sc. Chemistry 37 (5.51%), M.Sc. Maths 78 students (10.60%), M.Sc. Computer 7 students (1.04%) Almost all the students have entered their e-mail and cell numbers.


The survey was specified only for evaluating the Teaching and Learning Process in the institution. In total 20 questions were asked online to the students. A link was provided to the students on their WhatsApp to which the students provided the following responses.




Conclusion: -The syllabus completion graph shows that 51.50 percent of students said 85 to 100 % syllabus was covered. 32.60 percent of students said 70 to 84% syllabus was covered. 9.40 percent of students said 55 to 69% syllabus was covered.





Only 5.40 percent of students said indifferently as well as won't teach at all for teachers prepare for the classes. At lastly only 2 percent of students said always effective.































Conclusion: - It was concluded from the above Graph that, Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make students ready for the world of work, 53 percent majority of the students said to a great extent, whether only 27 percent of the students said moderate, whereas 12 percent students said somewhat, 5 percent vary little & only 3 percent students said not at all.



Conclusion: - Percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching graph shows that 39 percent of students said above 90 % while 28 percent of students said 70 to 89% ICT tools used whereas 13 percent majority of the students said 50 to 69%, only 9 percent students said 30 to 49 % and lastly one third of the student's 11 percent said below 29% of the teachers use ICT tools.
